National Peacekeepers Day 14<sup>th</sup> September 2025 Warragul RSL

For the fourth year, Warragul RSL held a Peacekeeper Commemoration service. This year we changed the date from the United Nations Peacekeepers Day, which is in May, to the National Peacekeepers Day in September which commemorates the anniversary of Australia's first involvement in peace operations on the 14 September 1947. National Peacekeepers' Day honours all Australian peacekeepers, peacemakers, peacebuilders and peace enforcers

Guest speaker was John Dunk who served in peacekeeping duties in Cyprus from 1973 to 1974 as part of the Victorian Police contingent. John gave the 40 attendees an overview of that peacekeeping mission and his personal experiences.



The new furniture was ordered and has arrived. The internal decorating has now also been completed.


We are looking to formally open the Veterans Centre on Friday 21st November. More information will be provided on this as we confirm the date.

The Long Tan Cross also now has a permanent home when not being used at the front of the building.




#### **Warragul 500 Poppies Project**
